Feeding your spirit

Having quiet time is essential but it doesn't have to be sitting with your eyes shut in a silent room. If that works for you then do it but others may find listening to music, going for a run, walking in God's creation, painting; anything that lifts your spirit to a place where you can thank God and praise Him. Start from this place looking at how good God is, being grateful and praising Him.



This is taking your thoughts away from yourself and your current situation (which could be dire) and focus' your thoughts onto God and how great He is. It is no mistake that when Jesus was asked how to pray, he began with stating who God is and then praising Him. Acknowledging God in this way takes you into His throne room and if you make this a priority every day, you will hear from God and the joy of the Lord will be yours

We feed our spirit by reading scripture; not just reading a passage, ticking the 'todays reading' box and moving on into our daily lives but allowing the word to sink in. Absorb it and allow revelation to come. This is where attempting to memorise passages from the Bible can help. The act of repeating some verses, preferably out loud, a number of times will make a difference to the atmosphere around and within you. God's word is a living thing, start to use it and you will notice a difference that will transform your experience of the Bible. If you stick with it even when your soul screams that it is dry, boring, you can't remember anything anyway so there is no point in doing it, you will see results. Ignore your soul and press on. Choose some favourite passages to start with perhaps write them on a post it note and take it with you so that you can practice in the car or in the bath, or just when you are pottering around. After a while passages will jump out at you and you will start to see areas of your life where that particular passage

What's on the inside will eventually surface to the outside. Feed your spirit, fight the flesh.

makes sense and then you may find you are turning it into a prayer. When this practice was suggested to me, my heart immediately plummeted and I thought it was a complete waste of time. Nevertheless, I gave it a go and at first I saw no change but then one day as I was driving to work, I saw in my mind's eye a picture of the words sinking into my skin and having an effect similar to that of washing tablet adverts where the dirt and grime just changes to

clean wherever the washing powder touches. That was a major turning point in my relationship with the Bible. I started to thirst for it and then I found when I read it that I had a new understanding and the words spoke personally to me. I love studying the Bible now but it all began with just persevering with a few dog eared post it notes.

Next time we will look at how to train your soul but in the meantime:

- 1. Find what lifts your spirit and make that a daily habit
- 2. From that place, spend some time just worshipping
- 3. Absorb small pieces of scripture

Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven




God's kingdom is established wherever people submit to His reign as King and carry out His will on earth, as it is done in heaven.
